

## Discover Wells

ells is located in York County, and was the third town established in Maine (1641). It was incorporated on July 5, 1653 and included Kennebunk and Ogunquit. Now approximately 60 square miles in size, the Town of Wells has a year-round population of about 10,000 people and a summer population of 40,000.

Wells is a seacoast town. From Drakes Island to Moody its 7 miles of shoreline form a crescent along the Atlantic Ocean and is lined with sandy beaches and rocky promontories.

The early settlers took advantage of this coast line and the numerous rivers in the area by establishing mills that served clusters of nearby farms. Stores, blacksmith shops, and post offices soon grew up nearby. Farmsteads, orchards and pasture lands, hay fields, and wood lots were also developed.

Just as the town began to grow the Indian Wars (first, King Phillip's War and then the French and Indian War, 1650 to 1730) took a toll on the residents and stunted the town's growth. Much of the commercial establishments and homes were destroyed in various skirmishes and "wars" with the French and the local Indian tribes. Wells has the distinction, however, of being the only Maine town not conquered during these various French and Indian wars.

Following the American Revolution and the War of 1812, Wells prospered from shipping and trade that extended to the West Indies and Europe. Shipbuilding and commerce using coastal schooners flourished. The railroad arrived in the 1840s providing local employment and accessibility from all directions. The rails soon displaced much of shipping freight business.

During this period people from outside the town began to discover Wells' beaches. By late in the century the "tourism" business began to emerge. This trend expanded during the 20th century and today Wells has a significant tourist economy.

The original guests were wealthy folk who stayed the whole summer. Large hotels along the water were built to meet the demand (a few still survive, like The Colony in Kennebunkport). When the automobile became more widely available after World War II, the length of stay changed to a few days or a week. Cabins and motels evolved to accommodate this generation of the traveling public.

Tourism still plays an important part in the livelihood of the town. Visitors will find a wide selection of fine hotels and motels, restaurants, gift and antique shops, and recreational facilities in the area

## Kennebunk/Kennebunkport Beaches

## Kennebunk Beaches

The Kennebunk beach area is made up of four sections: Gooch's Beach, Middle Beach, Parson's Beach, and Mother's Beach.

Parking is by permit only from June 15th through September 15th. The permits are valid for Gooch's Beach, Middle Beach, and Kennebunk Beach (aka Mother's Beach).

Parking stickers may be purchased at the Kennebunk Town Hall or at kiosks at the beaches. The kiosks sell day, week, or season passes and only accept credit/debit cards. Kennebunk parking passes cost \$25/day, \$100/week, or \$200/season (as of 5/1/17).

Gooch's Beach--Fine, sandy beach with gentle surf along Beach Avenue. Toilets. Lifeguards.

Middle Beach--Rocky beach with some sandy patches.

Mother's Beach--Sandy beach and playground. Great for small children. Playground. No facilities. Lifeguard on duty.

Parson's Beach--Privately owned beach but open to the public. It has a wide, sandy stretch of shoreline. Limited parking, though some new spots have been added recently across the street. Free. Portable toilet.

## Kennebunkport Beaches

Parking stickers are required for parking at Goose Rocks Beach beginning Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day weekend, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m.

Goose Rocks Beach parking stickers are sold at the Town Office, 6 Elm Street, 8 a.m. until 4:30 p.m.; Police Department, 101 Main Street 24 hours a day/7 days a week and at Goose Rocks Beach General Store (only daily nonresident stickers). Kennebunk port parking passes cost \$15/day, \$50/week, or \$100/season (5/1/17)

Goose Rocks Beach--Very soft sand, great for walking. 3 miles long. Scenic and beautiful. Trolley access. No facilities or lifeguard.

Colony (or Arundel) Beach--Very small (150 yard) beach. Sand, rocks, and pebbles. At the mouth of the Kennebunk River on the north side. Limited parking. No lifeguard. No permit required. No facilities

Cleaves Cove Beach-- Secluded and scenic beach off Ocean Avenue, Kennebunkport. No parking. No facilities. No lifeguards

## Ogunquit Beaches

Ogunquit Beach--Three miles of beautiful white sandy beach. Lifeguard and restrooms. Parking fee \$25/day.

Footbridge Beach--Part of Ogunquit Beach. Reached by footbridge over Ogunquit River. Snack bar and restrooms. Lifeguard patrolled.

#### Wells Beaches

Public Parking Lots are located at the end of Mile Road and the Eastern Shore, at the end of Atlantic Avenue and the Jetty and Gross Lot at Drakes Island. Fees for parking apply. Mile Road and Crescent Beach are hourly lots that accept only credit cards, debit cards, or coins.

Parking fees: \$120.00 per week; \$20.00 per day; \$12.00 12:00-5:00pm; and meters at Mile Road.

Wells Beach--Seven-mile-long sandy beach. Surfing areas. Free parking available.

Crescent Beach--About a half mile south of Wells Beach on Ocean. Free parking and lifeguard.

Drake's Island Beach--A long sandy beach and not as busy as the main section of Wells Beach. Limited parking at the lot on the eastern end of Drakes Island Road. Toilet facilities and lifeguards.

Moody Beach--a great spot to walk or to watch the dramatic rise and fall of the tide at the end of Ocean Ave in Wells. You can walk for miles on Moody Beach which eventually becomes North Beach, then Footbridge Beach and finally Ogunquit Beach.

Wells Harbor Beach-- At the end of Harbor Road. There's not much sand at high tide but it's a wonderful beach for children at mid-and low-tide. Lots of sand bars, and tidal pools with crabs. Less crowded than Wells Beach, toilet facilities, playground, picnic tables, and free parking.

### York Beaches

Long Sands Beach--1.5 miles of white sandy beach with a designated surfing area--public restrooms, handicapped parking, and access ramps. Parking meters or parking sticker. Lifeguards. Restaurants, take-out food and convenience stores within walking distance.

Short Sands Beach--A popular quarter mile long sandy beach-- public restrooms, seasonal lifeguards, and metered parking are available, as well as a large sandy playground, basketball courts, a gazebo, and a large grassy park area.

York Harbor Beach--Family oriented beach with public restrooms, seasonal lifeguards, and a gentle surf. Limited parking--requires a parking sticker.

York's Wild Kingdom--York's Wild Kingdom is a family-oriented zoo and amusement park centrally located in York Beach, Maine. Surrounded by beautiful forest and natural wetlands, the zoo is situated on 25 acres that have been set aside for the preservation of ecology. With 75 beautifully landscaped animal exhibits, 18 rides for all ages, five food and ice cream stands, and two gift shops, visitors of all ages will enjoy an entire day of fun. 23 Railroad Ave York. ## Children's Museum of New Hampshire---

the museum offers two levels of hands-on, custom-created exhibits for children ages 1-12. ## Monkey Trunks Extreme Aerial Adventure--rope courses and zip line offer great fun for everyone. Make reservations ahead of time. Seasonal. Waterfall Drive, Saco, (603) 367-4427.

Seacoast Science Center at Odiorne Point State Park--Odiorne Point State Park is open year-round. Visitors can enjoy sweeping views of the ocean and rocky shoreline and explorers can uncover evidence of past military occupation. An extensive network of trails, including a paved bike path, wind through the dense vegetation and traverse the park.

Located within Odiorne Point State Park is the Seacoast Science Center, which features exhibits relating to the natural and human history of Odiorne and the seacoast area. Visitors are welcome to touch and learn about tide pool animals in the indoor touch tank, watch deep ocean fish swim in the one thousand-gallon Gulf of Maine tank, and follow nearly four centuries of local history on a walk-through time. Funtown/Splashtown--With over 25 rides, Funtown USA is northern New England's largest water and amusement park. The park is the home of Maine's only wooden roller coaster "Excalibur," northern New England's largest vertical thrill ride, "Dragon's Descent," and New England's longest and tallest log flume ride "Thunder Falls." The park offers a vast selection of games, rides, shops, and family fun.

Splashtown USA is the water park located at Funtown Splashtown USA and is just the place to cool everyone down. It has over 12 different water features and slides and will provide your family with hours of fun. Both areas of the park have age-suitable "adventures" for the whole family. #### Lighthouses

Boon Island Light--is located on Boon Island off the southern coast near Cape Neddick in York. Boon Island Light has the distinction of being the tallest lighthouse in New England at 133 feet.

Goat Island Light--was established in 1835 to guard the entrance to Cape Porpoise Harbor, near Kennebunkport. It was automated in 1990 and is presently owned and operated by the Kennebunkport Conservation Trust. Summer visitors may view the light at high tide via boat or from the landing at the end of Pier Road in Cape Porpoise.

Nubble Light--in 1874 President Rutherford B. Hayes appropriated the sum of \$15,000 to build a lighthouse on this "Nub" of land and so began the informal name of this lighthouse. Finished in 1879, the lighthouse was staffed until 1987 when it became automated. It is run by the Town of York which plans to expand the area into a larger park. Sohier Park Road, York.

Portland Head Light--is the oldest lighthouse in the state. It was commissioned by George Washington in 1791 and is in Fort Williams Park, which overlooks Casco Bay. While the US Coast Guard maintains the actual light and the fog signal, the remainder of the property is managed by the Town of Cape Elizabeth.

Whaleback Light--Whaleback Light is a historic lighthouse marking the mouth of the Piscataqua River between New Castle, NH and Kittery, ME. It is located on a rocky outcrop offshore southwest of Fort Foster and south of Wood Island in Kittery.

## Walking/Hiking

## The Marginal Way, Ogunquit

The Marginal Way is a beautiful walking path that winds along Ogunquit's rocky coastline. It begins at the Perkins Cove parking lot, skirts the little cove, and winds north along the beach until it reaches Shore Road. Benches are spaced along the trail and provide relaxing places to smell the ocean air and watch the waves.

A loop can be made by following the Shore Road, at the end of the Marginal Way Trail, to Perkins Cove Road and back to the parking area. Dogs are not allowed on the path.

# The Mount Agamenticus Conservation Region, Ogunquit

This conservation region contains over 30,000 acres of land and is one of the largest remaining expanses of undeveloped forests in coastal New England. The land consists of a rich and unique coastal forest that supports the highest diversity of animal and plant species in all of Maine. The mountain and the surrounding area provide residents with an ideal location for hiking, biking, and sightseeing. There are over 30 miles of trails.

## Rachael Carson National Wildlife Refuge

The Rachel Carson Refuge was established in 1966 in cooperation with the State of Maine to protect the valuable salt marshes and estuaries for migratory birds. It has a variety of habitat types including forested upland, barrier beach/dune, coastal meadows, and tidal salt marsh.
